The General Committee – Who’s Who?



The National Liberal Club is owned by the members. There are more than 1,850 of us in the autumn of 2021 and, collectively, we are the Club's sovereign body – expressing our will through the Annual General Meeting and regular meetings of the **General Committee**, which we all elect.

Club members are now also the sole shareholders in the limited Company, set up in 1978, called **National Liberal Club Ltd**. This follows the Club's recent purchase of the controlling share in the Company from the Robson Charitable Trust – which saved the Club from financial ruin in the late 1970s.

The Company manages the day-to-day operations of the Club, runs its various services and hires and employs all the staff. The Board of Directors – all drawn from Club members plus its CEO -- are profiled separately on the **About Us** page of our website.

The working relationship between Club and Company has been under review, following the change outlined above, and the Club and the Board continue to work towards establishing working practices that produce the best outcomes for the Club and its members. So here is what you need to know about the 30 elected Club members, along with the honorary Officers and Vice-Presidents, who make up our **General Committee**:



TIM McNALLY

Club Chair *Joined Club 1985 Elected Gen Cttee 2016*

In my role as the Club's Chair, I attend all our main committees and sit on the Board of NLC Limited, while also serving as the link person for relations with the Liberal Democrats, Liberal International and the Alliance Party. I am a former LibDem councillor, and an Alderman of the London Borough of Southwark.

I run a Greenwich-based charity ICT company, TISL, and chair or serve as trustee for seven charities, mainly targeted at supporting the elderly, as well as chairing an educational foundation. GENEVIEVE ARBLASTER-HULLEY

Art Curator *Joined Club 2019*

As an expert on the construction history and the architecture of our Clubhouse, I am passionate about its conservation. It was the subject of my Master of Studies (Cantab) thesis, which followed a History of Art degree including the care and conservation of works of art. It is an honour to assist the Club in my capacity as Art Curator.

I have been a regular visitor to the Club since 2015, both as a guest of my (now) husband and for research purposes, before becoming a member. Previously a financial investment adviser, I swapped Bloomberg and spreadsheets for Borromini and Sickert. I now work as a heritage consultant advising on listed buildings.

I publish *inkswheatandtears.co.uk* – an online poetry and prose magazine with a small print section which has seen several pamphlets shortlisted for major poetry awards.

I sit on the board of *Poetry School*, described as the UK's largest provider of poetry education and 'inspiring tuition', and also support small-scale theatre productions, poetry scholarships and projects.

I stood for Parliament in Bridgwater and West Somerset in 2010 and 2015, and was a member of Wells City Council for eight years (including a year as Mayor).
